CPAA's De-Sex in the City Free & Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program

De-Sex in the City assists pet owners in getting their pets fixed and vaccinated at an affordable cost. We do require that pet owners be on government assistance or demonstrate financial need to get their pets fixed through De-Sex in the City. However, for Pit Bulls and Pit Bull mixes, there is no such requirement; CPAA will fix and vaccinate all Pit Bulls and Pit Bull mixes for free. We do appreciate donations, however, as that is how we keep our program running to help other pets in need. A \$50 donation is suggested for Pit Bulls and Pit Bull mixes, but a donation in ANY amount helps CPAA to help other PitBulls and PitBull mixes in need.

Please note that vaccines are provided to pets ONLY at the time of spay/neuter surgery; CPAA does not offer vaccines alone. Once payment is made and the requested information submitted, the vet office that partners with CPAA closest to where you live will contact you to set up the appointment. CPAA works with vets in Mechanicsburg, Red Lion, York, and Harrisburg. The vet office will usually contact you to set up the appointment within 1 to 3 days after we receive your information and payment.

If you do not have email call 570-994-5846. The phone is only answered while volunteers are at Brodheadsville on days that clinic is open.

Cats: \$60 cash only for spay or neuter (fee includes rabies and distemper vaccines if needed)

\$35 cash only Feral or free roaming cats (A feral/stray cat does not live in your house, includes rabies vaccine and left ear tip for identification-no exception.)

Dogs: please read "info prior to k9 surgery page".

\$125 cash only for neuter - Male Dogs

\$175 cash only for spay - Female Dogs

(vaccinations are extra, no vaccines given on day of surgery)

Dogs that are over weight may be charged extra.

If you are scheduling more than one dog you will be asked to pay a non-refundable deposit. If you use pay pal there will be an extra \$5 fee.

Your dog must have current distemper/rabies vaccine. If you need help

with this please ask. Owners of dogs must be present unless other arrangements have been made prior to appointment.

Pre-operative in-house bloodwork -- \$40 highly recommended, not required for dogs and cats over 7 years of age.

Pre-operative bloodwork is available at Brodheadsville Clinic and Wilkes Barre Clinic. It is not available on the spaymobile.

All cats will be spayed or neutered, given rabies and FVRCP (distemper) vaccinations, treated with Revolution (flea, roundworm / hookworm and ear mite treatment) and ear tipped for identification as fixed animals. **The cost is \$30.00 and AN APPOINTMENT IS NECESSARY.** Appointments can be made by calling (717) 687-7297. Helping Hands currently holds clinics EVERY Tuesday and Wednesday. Please note that due to limited resources, all cats must be able to be trapped and transported to our facility which is located on New Danville Pike, Lancaster, PA.
